The Canopy Grand Rapids | Downtown art collection was carefully curated to reinforce the hotel's overall design mission as an outward expression of Michigan Mid-Century design, architecture, furnishings and culture. Each selection draws upon the theme of the timeless international modern style and features a wide array of talented creatives – many of whom have connections to the region. # Stephen Frykholm (b. 1942) Picnic Posters, 1970–89 Screen Prints

Born in Seattle. Stephen Frykholm's formative years were spent in Kansas City. After earning a BFA in Advertising Art from Bradley University in 1965, he became a Peace Corps Volunteer in Aba, Nigeria teaching at the Government Trade School for Girls. There he taught the young women and himself how to screen print. Frykholm earned an MFA in Design from Cranbrook Academy of Art in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan in 1969. At the beginning of 1970 he was hired as the first in-house graphic designer at Herman Miller, Inc., and his professional career began. One of his first projects was to design a poster for the company's annual summer picnic, which he continued designing for nineteen more years. In 2015 Frykholm retired as Vice President of Creative Design at the famed furniture company. During his career he was the recipient of numerous graphic design and communications awards. In 2007 he became an AIGA Fellow, and in 2010 he received the AIGA Medal, the highest recognition from AIGA, the professional association for design. Frykholm currently lives nearby in downtown Grand Rapics.



Lora Fosberg (b. 1966)

Using her own unique visual language, Lora Fosberg brings together two and three dimensional materials to give a fresh look to familiar objects from our everyday lives. The artist currently resides in Southwestern Michigan and has exhibited widely throughout the United States and abroad. She received her BFA from the University of Illinois, Champaign, IL, and her MFA from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago.

Variations is a large-scale meditative video installation inspired by mid-century color palettes and textile design. Like a musical score, the piece moves through different arrangements of colors and patterns. The constant flow of imagery, shifting from full color frames to vertical planes, creates a living moving image. Edyta Stepien is a creative and artist working in the field of video installation and motion design. Founded by Chuck Przybyl and Stepien in 2014 - Most Visual builds on the strengths of its core creatives to construct compelling stories with impressive visuals.

With a playful use of color and a textural emphasis in materials and techniques, Lora Forsberg creates an intriguing range of small sculptures that combine to create an impressive collection of art objects that builds upon the themes explored in the artist's body of work in a lighthearted and approachable palette.

Michigan has been at the forefront of American Modernism from cars to architecture to furniture design. The combination of General Motors, Cranbrook Academy, and Herman Miller attracted and shaped some of the most renown architects & designers of the twentieth century. From Eero Saarinen and Minoru Yamasaki, to George Nelson, Alexander Girard, and Charles & Ray Eames -

Michigan has been arguably the greatest exporter of modern design since the Bauhaus. Here, the collected artworks act as an ode to the myriad of modern treasures that Michigan has both created and inspired.

Johnny Abrahams (b. 1979)

Johnny Abrahams' work is an exploration into the vast ontological realm between line and architecture. Through repetition and subtle interactions between the void and painted form, the sharp compositions focus on structure, rhythm, gravity and negative space. Spreading oil paint across the painting with a giant palette knife, slight and arbitrary ridges are revealed in surfaces that at first appear to be smooth and flat, adding to the nuances found upon closer examination.

Inspired by the urban and rural landscapes of home, Emmett Kerrigan' assembles collected regional imagery into new compositions of vibrant blues and greens, subdued yellows, and rich earth tones. Kerrigan's process is an exhaustive practice of building layers upon layers of paint on to the surface that he then manipulates with a palette knife, pushing up the paint to create ridges marking boundaries that are both physical and psychological. Kerrigan received his BFA from the Kansas City Art Institute in 1993. He has shown extensively throughout the Midwest.

Jayes Caitlin (b. 1988)

Los Angeles-basesd Jayes Caitlin is an abstract painter, designer, and screen printer. Her projects utilize screen printing, collage, painting, fibers, and publishing as medium, sharing an abstract aesthetic for bright colors, collage, textures, shapes, and the use of plastic-y, viscus liquids on canvas or paper. She is co-owner of the Chinatown-based collaborative printmaking studio Print Shop LA, and owner-operator of publishing imprint Heavy Gel - producing records, tapes, art prints, gig posters, original works, and artist books for art and music clients.
